On Thursday, October 14th, 2021 ATA's monthly meeting was held hybridly at The Historic Stone House at Parks & People and via Zoom video conference call. **Graham Coreil-Allen**, NATA's President, introduced himself and opened the meeting. NATA Chaplain and resident **Deacon Tally** led the residents in a prayer. The minutes from the September 9th meeting were read by **Felipe Goncalves**, Sergeant At Arms, and approved as read. **President Graham Coreil Allen** welcomed members and began the meeting.

Agenda:

- **P/O Morales, Baltimore City Police Western District Police Department** updated ATA members on crime statistics and concerns in our area included cameras on Bryant Avenue and the Citiwatch program.
- **Reginald Williams** from the States Attorneys office gave residents a report on crime and crime enforcement in our area. Mr. Williams informed residents about various happenings including Chat and Chew, prayer walks, and a "prosecution cheat sheet" which shows what the States Attorney's Office is and is not prosecuting so that residents know when and how to correctly report incidents - this will be emailed to residents.
- **Javas Raghavan, representative for 7th District Councilman James Torrence** made residents aware of a meeting 5 pm, 10/20 at Mondawmin Mall. Councilman Torrence and his staff encourage residents to reach out to him at district7staff@baltimorecity.gov for help with any concerns or issues.
- **Laura VanWert**, from MDOT MTA's North Avenue Rising project walked residents through the MDOT's North Ave Uprising Website. The main priority is safer travel for people without cars. Traffic police will start enforcement of new bus lanes in early November. with preemptive warnings for the next couple of weeks. Fines will be up to \$500 for improper use of the bus lane.
- ATA officially inducted two Legacy Residents- Mario Chang (store owner) and Mona Lisa Dialo were officially inducted with full member rights
