On Thursday, November 11th, 2021 ATA's monthly meeting was held hybridly at The Historic Stone House at Parks & People and via Zoom video conference call. **Graham Coreil-Allen**, NATA's President, introduced himself and opened the meeting. NATA's **Neighborhood Coordinating Officer Morales** led the residents in a prayer. The minutes from the October 14th meeting were read by **Anne Goncalves**, recording secretary, and approved as read. **President Graham Coreil Allen** welcomed members and began the meeting.

Agenda:

- **Neighborhood Coordination P/O Morales, Baltimore City Police Western District Police Department** updated ATA members on increased efforts in the Mondawmin Mall/ Robert Coleman/ Parkview/Woodbrook area including MME units, rat units (asset recovery) extra patrols and round the clock units. Officer Morales made his contact information available to residents.
- **Reginald Williams** ATA's community liaison from the States Attorneys office gave residents a report on crime and crime enforcement in our area. All victim related crimes are being prosecuted. All drug trafficking crimes are being prosecuted. Open/closed case info was made available and is also available through Court Watch.
- **7th District Councilman James Torrence** made residents aware of rental assistance programs available via bmorechildren.com. As always please reach out to district7staff@baltimorecity.gov There will be a community walk Wednesday 11/17 from 430-6 PM, meeting at 3200 Auchentoroly Terrace; everyone is welcome to join for free and open conversation about the tactical issues in our neighborhood and have face time with the councilman.
- **Maria Goodson** THREAD is a non profit in Baltimore City which operates out of the Mondawmin Mall Touchpoint Storefront. It is a huge community of people from all walks of life that come together to make sure that everyone in the community has what they need to be successful. Volunteers from various walks of life come together to rally their support around student applicants from the bottom 25% of classes in 6 Baltimore City high schools. Individuals are encouraged to join if they are interested in getting to know a young person that could use support but also adults from various parts of the city. - **Maria Smalldone**, from the **Neighborhood Housing Services** shared information about foreclosure counseling programs to prevent foreclosure for homeowners. If you or a neighbor are having trouble making mortgage payments, are behind on escrow, or are coming to the end of a forbearance agreement please contact the NHS foreclosure manager Jessica Stein who would be happy to get you on a list when the program rolls out.
- **Ms Crystal Parker**, a **Baltimore City COVID Ambassador**, shared official updates and resources with residents regarding COVID. Both Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have been approved for ages 5-11. Booster versus third dosage: if you are immunocompromised you are suggested to take a third dose at least 28 days after your second dose and a booster shot 6 months after your second dose. If you are not immunocompromised your doctor may recommend a booster shot 6 months after your second dosage. Mixed dosages have been approved- you can have a booster of a different brand than your original vaccine. Ms Parker can be reached at
